UK Maths Challenge Junior Competitions

After the success of students in Years 9, 10 and 11 in the Intermediate Maths Challenge, and Pink Kangaroo competitions in March, we can now offer huge congratulations to students in Year 7 and 8 who competed in the Junior Maths Challenge in April. The Junior Maths Challenge is a national competition which has participants across the country sitting a 60-minute maths paper full of problem solving, puzzles and reasoning questions, which can be a little different to those questions students see in their lessons at school. So, students were prepared for the competition through starters and plenaries using questions from previous years competitions. We entered 220 students and 69 of these scored highly enough to be awarded certificates which were presented to them in their assemblies.

42 students achieved a Bronze Award, 24 achieved a Silver Award, and a special mention must go to Riley B from Year 7 who achieved Gold and Best in School, and to Megan M from Year 7, and Joe G from Year 8 who also achieved Gold Awards. All three sat the follow up Kangaroo competition on 14 June. Megan had great success in this competition, achieving a Merit, which is only awarded to the top 25% of participating students! We are very proud of Megan for this amazing achievement. Congratulations to everyone who participated. We look forward to next years' competitions and what awards they will bring.

On Monday 10 July, our year 7 scientists swapped the laboratory environment of the classroom to the great outdoors! Almost 300 students, around thirty staff and nine year 12 volunteers all descended upon our Mill Road field and the picturesque Promenade Park.

The students were immersed in a world of ecology, closely observing the flora and fauna of the woodland, grass and saltmarsh habitats. Students were using real ecological sampling techniques including pond dipping, sweep netting, soil testing, and transect sampling. They were then tasked with identifying the invertebrates that they had collected. New for this year they also experienced a bird survey and ecology bingo! The students conducted themselves well and demonstrated genuine enthusiasm as they fully engaged in the activities.

At the end of a tiring but highly productive day, students were treated to a fascinating presentation by our Head Girl, Harriet Phillips. She spoke with great passion and inspiration as she told the story of her own journey of environmental campaigning though the WWF, and her experience of engaging with big names in environmental protection including Feargal Sharkey and the one and only Sir David Attenborough.
