Prior Learning

The Year 9 curriculum builds on prior learning in by...

- Extending the range of textiles techniques to explore
- Giving pupils the opportunity to challenge themselves in each practical lesson
- Developing knowledge of fibres, fabrics, influential figures and the environment

Curriculum Intent - What are the curriculum aims?

- Developing and nurturing practical skills
- Building confidence with using machinery
- Developing design skills
- Understanding the environmental, social and moral aspects of Textiles

Curriculum Implementation – What my child will be learning?

Term 1	Skills Portfolio Theory: Pupils will learn a range of theory including: fibres, fabrics, smart materials and e-textiles. Practical: Pupils will trial a range of skills including machine sewing, quilting and patchwork.
Term 2	Interiors Theory: Pupils will implement their design skills, and learn to complete a production plan. Practical: Pupils will learn a fabric dyeing technique, and make an interior product of their own choice/design.
Term 3	Recycling Theory: Pupils will learn about design development, iterative design, fashion designers and sustainability. Practical: Pupils will learn how to make a bag.

Curriculum Impact – How will progress be assessed?

Progress is assessed over 5 strands in Textiles:

Research – pupils will research information that is relevant to their learning. This will be assessed by the teacher.

Designing – pupils will design their own products. This will be peer assessed and teacher assessed. **Planning** – pupils will learn to plan and sequence their practical lessons. This will be assessed by the teacher.

Making – practical skills are assessed over a series of lessons This will be assessed both by the teacher and peer/self-assessment.

Evaluating – Pupils will evaluate their practical work each lesson, either in the form of a self-assessment or an extending writing task which is assessed by the teacher.
