Dear Parents, Carers and members of the Maldon Community,

First of all, I hope this message finds you and your loved ones as well as you can possibly be.

As we close out the first half of the spring term, I would like to take this opportunity to reflect back on another very busy six weeks across both

campuses, inside as well as outside the classroom. Together with members of the academy's Senior Leadership Team, we have continued to visit classes on a daily basis receiving a warm welcome from students and staff on each and every occasion. To observe, and on many an occasion, partake in the work being conducted. Also, to ask questions of our students and to hear from them the work they have been doing and what they have learnt. This has included me visiting every single classroom at our Mill Road Campus during period two on Tuesday and together with Mr Baster and Mrs Clark, our Joint Heads of Academy, every single classroom during period one yesterday. As was observed and fed back to all staff, what we witnessed was typically good practice with some outstanding elements, however, we also know there remains much to work on and across all areas of our practice. We know what and where these areas are, however, and continue to drive forensic plans aimed at further developing these – something we will continue to do in our usual unrelenting manner moving forward.

This term has also seen us continue to drive our cultural capital agenda with a significant numbers of extra-curricular activities and events taking place from sporting fixtures to in-house events, and from numerous trips and visits to the welcoming in of many high quality guest speakers. This included a Holocaust survivor, Susie Barnett BEM, delivering a one hour presentation on her life, especially between 1938 to 1945, to all 308 of our Year 9 students on Wednesday afternoon.

I will close out this message by paying due respect to our former colleague and Faculty leader for Business and Information Technology, Mr Matt Preece, who passed away a few weeks back. Mr Preece served Plume exceptionally well for many years before moving off with his wife, Mrs Lynne Preece, another outstanding former colleague, to a new life in the South West. Very sadly, they were not able to fulfil this dream as Mr Preece became ill and bravely fought a terrible condition for some time before finally succumbing to it. He will be laid to rest tomorrow with many members of staff travelling down to attend the service and support Mrs Preece and their children, Owen and Rhianna, themselves both former Plume students. Today, as the Plume Family, we pay our respects and remember with fondness Mr Preece and have set up a table of condolence in our main reception at our Fambridge Road Campus centred around his favourite colour, red.



The three day programme is a unique development opportunity to become an accredited partner of the UK Parliament Education and Engagement Team. The key objectives of the programme were:

To explore how we at Plume can raise our students' awareness of key aspects of UK Parliament. To identify links within our Personal Development curriculum and opportunities for Plume students to engage with UK Parliament.

The three day course included opportunities to meet the House of Commons Speaker and Lords Speaker, attend briefings to gain a greater understanding of how Parliament works, an immersive visit to the Parliament Education Centre, tours of the House of Commons and House of Lords and an opportunity to meet your MP.

It was a genuine honour to meet with Sir John Whittingdale. Not only was he one of the few MPs that attended the event, but he also afforded me a considerable amount of his precious time to explain the workings of parliament together with a tour of his offices in Portcullis House. Not only was Sir John generous with his time for me but he also offered his knowledge and passion of politics to our students through future visits.

So many decisions made in parliament today are going to have a direct impact on our students, now and in their future lives whether they remain local to the area or relocate to other areas of the country. We need to empower them to be able to understand what those decisions are and how they are made. Never before have students been more interested in politics and how parliamentary decisions will have an impact on their lives as well as the communities in which they live.
