Prior Learning

The subject builds on students' skills and experience at key stage three, composition, performance and listening. Students will continue to develop their specialist instrumental skills and it is expected that student will have lessons on their specialised instrument. They will need to have a sound understanding of music technology and have an appreciation of music from different genres and musical traditions.

Curriculum Intent - What are the curriculum aims?

To ensure students reach their true musical potential, develop a lifelong passion of music and to ensure they are prepared for the next stage in their musical career.

Students will perform and record a further two pieces of music, a solo piece and a performance and piece as part of an ensemble. In terms of composition students will be expected to complete a free composition and a composition to a brief set by the exam board in September of year 11. Students will then re visit all the areas of study completed in year 10 and will broaden and deepen their understanding of the following areas of study - Concerto through time, Rhythms of the world, Film music and Conventions of pop.

Students will have the opportunity to take part in a large number of performance opportunities both inside the Academy and as part of the local community and a variety of trips and visits will form part of the course to support the listening aspect of the course.

It is the aim to complete all course work by Christmas of year 11 to allow for Close The Gap activities.

Curriculum Impact – How will progress be assessed as I learn?

Students will complete termly listening assessment. These will be ninety minutes long and will be past GCSE papers.

Students will also submit either a composition or performance which will be assessed using GCSE criteria, students will have the opportunity to improve their work and re submit for marking.

Towards the end of Year 10 students will complete a formal Mock listening examination.
