


All buses and taxis will be ready at this time.



BIRMINGHAM I 2022 Commonwealth in games

Since joining Plume Academy in 2014, I have been extremely fortunate that the academy has supported me in my journey as an international swimming referee.

I have been involved in competitive swimming for 30 years - as a swimmer, lifeguard, teacher, official and gala organiser. For all of that time, I have been a member of Basildon & Phoenix Swimming Club.

I tend to focus on officiating and organising galas nowadays as I can fit this around my role at Plume. In 2015, I was very lucky to be appointed by British Swimming as one of their six international referees. This resulted in me travelling widely, attending Olympic, World and European events. I also organise the swimming section of the World University Games.



Undoubtedly the highlight of my swimming career was when I was appointed as the referee for the Birmingham 2022 Commonwealth Games, where I was responsible for the women's swimming events. My time in Birmingham in July was incredible meeting people from all over the world. attending the opening ceremony and hearing the roar of 6,000 people cheering on swimmers in races I was referee refereeing. I also had the honour of refereeing a world record set by Australia in the 4x200m Freestyle Relay. Lots of people messaged me to say that they had seen me on the television during the games - my family took great pleasure in sending me pictures where I was seemingly pulling a face or looking a bit silly. It was great to receive these messages, but I suppose what people do not see are the many, many years spent volunteering at grass-roots sports, perhaps doing necessary jobs that others do not

want to do. My advice to anyone seeking to reach an international standard in sport is to see every grass root event or mundane training session as a opportunity to improve - there is huge power in being resilient, always persevering and saying 'yes' to doing something when many others say 'no'. If I can do it - so can you!

I would like to place on record my immense gratitude to everyone at the academy for supporting me with my swimming career. It is honour to be involved in sport at this level and I could not have done it without the support of Plume.
