Prior Learning

The course builds on prior learning by... supporting learners' progression from Year 12 to Year 13 by broadening knowledge of human criminal behaviour and the criminal justice system and further develops skills of application, analysis and evaluation.

Curriculum Intent – What are the curriculum aims?

- Unit 3 provides an understanding of the criminal justice system from the moment a crime has been identified to the verdict. Learners will develop the understanding and skills needed to examine information in order to review the justice of verdicts in criminal cases
- Unit 4 allows learners to apply their understanding of the awareness of criminality, criminological theories and the process of bringing an accused to court in order to evaluate the effectiveness of social control to deliver criminal justice policy.
- The course allows learners to consider how the use and application of their learning impacts upon themselves, other individuals, employers, society and the environment
- The applied purpose allows learners to develop:
 - Skills required for independent learning and development
 - The ability to solve problems
 - The skills of project based research, development and presentation
 - The ability to apply learning in vocational contexts
- To gain the required understanding and skills to be able to consider employment within some aspects of the criminal justice system

Unit 3: This unit is internally assessed and externally moderated. In two sittings, students will complete an 8-hour assessment under controlled conditions.

Unit 2: 90-minute external examination.

Students will receive a combination of verbal and written feedback from teaching staff, dependent on the type of work produced. Pupils will be expected to participate actively in whole-class discussions.
