Prior Learning

The Year 2021 curriculum builds on prior learning of KS2 Art and Design and pupils should be taught to develop techniques, including control and of materials, with creativity, experimentation and an increasing awareness of different kinds of art, craft and design.

Pupils should have been taught:

- to create sketch books to record their observations and use them to review and revisit ideas.
- to improve their mastery of art and design techniques, including drawing, painting and sculpture with a range of materials [for example, pencil, charcoal, paint, clay].
- about great artists, architects, and designers in history.

Curriculum Intent – What are the curriculum aims?

The Year 7 art aims are to produce creative work, exploring their ideas and recording their experiences. Students should become proficient in drawing, painting, sculpture and other art, craft and design techniques. In their work they should learn to evaluate and analyse creative works using the language of art, craft and design. Additionally, they should know about great artists, craft makers and designers, and understand the historical and cultural development of their art forms.

Curriculum Implementation – What my child will be learning?

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| Term 1 | Half Term 1 | Module 1: Sails and reflections Base line drawing assessment of Thames Barge and painting skills linked to artist study. |
| | Half Term 2 | Independent study seascapes and reflections. |
| Term 2 | Half Term 3 | Module 2: Observational drawing Base line drawing assessment and mark making skills with pencil, charcoal and Indian ink. |
| | Half Term 4 | Independent study still life drawing. |
| Term 3 | Half Term 5 | Module 3: Contextual Study Base line drawing assessment and skills in colour theory. |
| | Half Term 6 | Independent study Craig Martin response. |



Curriculum Impact – How will progress be assessed?

Each term students will have a formative tracking sheet attached in the back of their sketchbooks. They will get each term a drawing baseline assessment, a skills level, learnability grade and then do a final independent study which will be levelled as a summative assessment taking on board all the work from that module.
