Our students also look exceptionally smart across both campuses and appear focused, attentive and energised in their lessons.

The turnout at extra-curricular and enrichment clubs, again, across both campuses have been significant in number already, and our new staff, both teaching and support, have also settled in very well and are contributing well to the academy already via their individual positions and roles.

On Monday, we also saw the passing of our former Town Mayor and member of the Town Council, Cllr. David Ogg. David was such a vibrant, charismatic, innovative and intelligent man who was always such fantastic company and to be in the presence of. He served the town exceptionally well during his year as Mayor and raised a great deal of money for a number of his chosen charities. David was also from Canvey Island, the town where my wife and children are from and actually went to the same school as my wife, her brother and my best friend. It was also the very first school I taught at nearly three decades ago now and as I alluded to earlier, where I went back to teach in 2002. As many within this community will agree I'm sure, whilst David will be hugely missed, his indomitable spirit will live on in his lovely wife Sharon, his many friends and associates, and all who were fortunate enough to know him.

Who is a Young Carer?

- Young carers are children and young people under 18 years old who provide regular and on-going care
 to another person who is physically or mentally ill, disabled or misuses substances.
- Young adult carers are aged between 16 and 24 and can also access support from our local services.
- Many Young people don't see themselves as carers and may not realise there is practical and emotional support available in Essex and the Academy.

You may be a young carer if you:

- · care for a family member, because of illness, disability or old age
- · help someone with bathing or dressing, going to the toilet or getting into/out of bed
- · need to cook for your family
- · look after money or organise the family budget
- · help anyone to take medication regularly
- · collect prescriptions or benefits on behalf of someone else or go shopping for the family
- · look after brothers or sisters, by taking them to school, doing their laundry, or cooking their meals
- take care of housework, such as dusting, hoovering, washing or ironing
- · speak on behalf of someone who has difficulty speaking or communicating for themselves
- translate or interpret for someone at home

a ballad, free verse, or just a mixture of poetic ideas that you like!



Plume Academy collaborates with Joseph Henry Unwin Sick Poor Fund to help benefit students' mental health

Councillor Mark Heard, Chairman of The Joseph Henry Unwin Sick Poor Fund, explains how the charity has been working with Plume Academy to benefit young people's mental health.~Joseph Henry Unwin was a Maldon-born man who worked as a commercial clerk at the Maldon Iron Works. He lived at 81 High Street (currently Bluebell Boutique) and died in 1919.

Joseph felt that, after the First World War, the 'land fit for heroes' wasn't helping the returning sick and wounded heroes enough. He left some money in his will for the establishment of a local charity to "assist the sick and needy of Maldon with medical provision, holidays and other aids to make life more bearable". This became the Joseph Henry Unwin Sick Poor Fund. Following the pandemic, the charity has seen calls to mental health departments rocket. The committee felt the need for investment in mental health facilities, particularly for young people struggling to cope with all the changes.

11 to 13-year-olds are educated at the Mill Road Campus, Maldon. There is a large garden at the rear of the playground that has been out of use and has become overgrown over the last nine years.

Plume Academy was keen to develop this space into something both members of the academy and the wider Maldon community can benefit from.

The committee felt this project would really benefit young people's mental health as a place to find peace and social inclusion. We are working with the academy to make this great project happen, thanks to donations from Maldon Rotary Club and the <u>Beeleigh Abbey Lodge Masons</u>. Carl Wakefield, Executive Principal at Plume Academy, said: "I sincerely thank this fantastic, long-established charity for their tremendous support.

"This current space will be turned into something quite special - by replacing the old, rotting shed with a new one, replacing the plastic on the poly-tunnel frame, and creating a 'reflection corner' with some beautiful garden objects."

The academy also proposes to add some vegetable and wildflower plots to create a community project and garden.

Year / Ecology Day 202

A scorching Ecology Day as nearly 300 excited year 7 students descended on the Promenade Park and Mill Road Campus field on Friday 15 July to experience the living world first hand. The classroom atmosphere was fresh air, sunshine and living things of all shapes and sizes. Students were able to get stuck into some real science out in the field!

Students were fascinated by the biodiversity of the trees and plant species and the variety of invertebrates, often well-hidden in the grass, trees or mud at the bottom of the stream.

Students had the opportunity to experience real ecological activities such as sweep netting, tree sampling, pond dipping, quadrat sampling and chemical analysis of soil. These are all techniques used in the field by real life ecologists to study distribution of living things and the potential impacts of human activities on the ecosystems upon which we depend. Our students were well-behaved and fully immersed in the activities; they enjoyed their day tremendously. A huge thank you must go to all the Year 7 tutors and pastoral team, the SEND team, the Year 12 biologists, site and catering teams, the science faculty, and anyone who supported the event.

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school, when they're unwell. There are government guidelines for schools about managing specific infectious diseases at GOV.UK. These say when students should be kept off school and when they shouldn't.

Is my child too ill for school?

There are government guidelines for schools about <u>managing specific infectious diseases at GOV.UK</u>. These say when children should be kept off school and when they shouldn't.

If you do keep your child at home, it's important to phone the academy each day. Let them know that your child won't be in and give them the reason.

If your child is well enough to go to school but has an infection that could be passed on, such as a cold sore or head lice, let their teacher know.

Other illnesses

Follow this advice if your child does not have coronavirus symptoms or they had a test and it was negative (they do not have coronavirus).

Coughs and colds

It's fine to send your child to school with a minor <u>cough</u> or <u>common cold</u>. But if they have a fever, keep them off school until the fever goes. Encourage your child to throw away any used tissues and to wash their hands regularly.

High temperature

If your child has a <u>high temperature</u>, keep them off school until it goes away.

Chickenpox

If your child has <u>chickenpox</u>, keep them off school until all the spots have crusted over.

This is usually about 5 days after the spots first appeared.

Cold sores

There's no need to keep your child off school if they have a <u>cold sore</u>. Encourage them not to touch the blister or kiss anyone while they have the cold sore, or to share things like cups and towels.

Conjunctivitis

You don't need to keep your child away from school if they have <u>conjunctivitis</u>.

Do get advice from your pharmacist. Encourage your child not to rub their eyes and to wash their hands regularly.

Coronavirus (COVID-19)

Your child should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people if they have <u>symptoms of COVID-19</u> and they either:

- have a high temperature
- do not feel well enough to go to school or do their normal activities

If they have mild symptoms and they feel well enough, they can still go to school.

Ear infection

If your child has an <u>ear infection</u> and a high temperature or severe earache, keep them off school until they're feeling better or their high temperature goes away.

Hand, foot and mouth disease

If your child has <u>hand, foot and mouth disease</u> but seems well enough to go to school, there's no need to keep them off.

Encourage your child to throw away any used tissues straight away and to wash their hands regularly.

Head lice and nits

There's no need to keep your child off school if they have head lice.
