On Monday 20 March, the Lord Chief Justice, Lord Ian Burnett of Maldon, visited the academy along with three other judges and a lay magistrate. This fantastic opportunity afforded students in Years 9-11 and KS5 A level Law students the chance to hear about the work of judges, the justice system, and the rule of law.

The Lord Chief Justice visited the academy as part of a school engagement programme that judges are involved in across the country. He spoke about the

rule of law and how lucky people are to live in a country that abides by this rule.

He said: "The rule of law is fundamental to our British way of life. Every day, many thousands of judges make decisions which affect people's lives, and their livelihoods. But most people have little idea of what goes on unless they find themselves in the system."

All judges present explained how they trained, qualified and how the legal profession is more diverse today than in the past. They discussed the challenges and opportunities that face students wishing to pursue a career in any of the legal professions.

Lord Burnett answered a wide range of questions posed by College students; Jessica Watkin, Joe Harrington, Cameron Smith, Emre Dogru, Adele Blanke, Rebecca Laker, Ella Butcher and Grace Jackson.

Amongst other questions, he was asked about was his role in the inquest following the death of Princess Diana, about what part of his career he enjoyed the most and what his role in the Privy Council entailed.

Lord Burnett then joined his legal colleagues for a further series of questions about law and career paths within the legal system asked by students in Years 9-11.

The visit ended by an informal chat with the college students studying law, which gave these students a further opportunity to ask detailed questions about career pathways in the legal profession.

Maldon Pioneers invited to improve their digital skills

Year 12 Princes' Trust students along with teachers Ms Tween and Ms Baker hosted a digital skills event for the Maldon Pioneers visiting the academy. Students as part of their study programme worked one to one with nine Pioneers to support a range of digital skills questions posed by our visitors.

The Maldon Pioneers Association was set up in 1982 to provide activities for local adults with mild to moderate learning disabilities whose needs were not severe enough to be eligible for local authority resources but were not able to participate in their community activities independently.

Mr Baster, Joint Head of Academy, who visited the classroom during the session was very impressed with how our students worked so seamlessly with our guests. He went on to invite the Pioneers back later in the Summer term for a high tea to feedback on what they have learned and used.

Ms Tween said, "this is a fantastic experience for our students and hugely valuable for them and their course"




