

Characteristics of outstanding learning:

- Students are resilient, work beyond their comfort zone, rising to challenges and making a personal commitment to develop understanding
- Students are able to relate ideas to previous knowledge and real life
- Students seek patterns and underlying principles.

- Students check evidence and relate it to conclusions
- Students examine logic and argument critically and cautiously
- Students review their learning regularly



Reporting to parents/carers - Log in to Go4Schools

Attendance – Sessions, Missed, Lates

Current Grade – What grade the student is currently working at – may be lower/same/higher than predicted grade

MEG – The minimum expected grade for the student – not a TARGET

Predicted Grade – The grade the subject teacher feels that the student will achieve at the end of the course – it can be lower than the MEG

BfL – Behaviour that is needed in lessons to make significant progress Colour Coded for progress







Intervention...at Years 10 and 11

You child may be invited to additional Mathematics and/or English lessons. This is a government-funded initiative (The National Tutoring Programme).

These may take place at registration and/or after school. This is particularly targeted at students on the 3-4 and 6-7 borderline.

Students who engage in this programme generally achieve a grade higher than those who do not. We would encourage students to participate in all subjects.

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Exam Time...planning ahead for 2025

Research data shows that early study leave has a detrimental impact on outcomes.

In 2023, students remained in lessons until May half term, but we encouraged to continue attending lessons after half term, until the completion of the examination in that subject.

Staff conventionally offer revision at Easter and occasionally in the June half term, the evening before some exams and in warm-ups sessions before exams.




Daily Routine

What is the correct daily routine for successful learning?

Do you need to adjust your daily routine to ensure you are ready to commence your studies at Plume Academy?

Preparation is the key to success!





Daily Routine

Setting the correct daily routine for successful learning:

- 1. An early night a good night's sleep (i.e. 8 quality hours+) is vital for learning and memory
- 2. Set out everything the night before be organised. Set out school clothes and pack your bag including a bottle of water
- 3. Set an alarm and give yourself enough time to get ready
- 4. Have a **shower** it will make you feel fresh and ready for your day
- 5. Eat breakfast fuel your body with healthy food. Eating breakfast has been proven to improve concentration, alertness, comprehension, memory and learning
- 6. Be punctual ensure you give yourself enough time to get to the academy. It is better to arrive early than arrive late. Remember there will be a great deal of traffic in Maldon by 8.15 am so you will need to leave early to avoid the traffic congestion
- 7. Arrive with a **positive 'can do' mindset** successful learners are positive learners







Monday 15th July – Tuesday 23rd July 2024



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Why we offer a work experience placement

To allow students to gain knowledge and understanding of how industry operates.

To help students understand the importance of the school curriculum in the world of work.

To provide students with the opportunity to develop vital employability skills such as self confidence, communication and time keeping.

To provide students with the opportunity experiences possible career paths and understand further training they need to undertake in their chosen sector.



What support is place to assist students finding a placement?

Whole year group assemblies throughout the process.

Use of the Unifrog platform to assist in the administration process.

Creation of a data base of possible placements to be shared with students.

Email / Letter template idea available to download via the website.

Support available via Learning group leader in Learning group time. Opportunity to arrange a meeting with myself to discuss placement ideas



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How you can support your child in finding a placement?

Discuss their current interests and ideas/plan for the future.

Help them identify their personal strengths which will be vital for employability

Visit the careers section of the academy website (especially the careers hub) to get information and ideas. There might careers which may be of interest. Use google to find local companies. If they have a favourite subject in school you could suggest talking to HoF about a role they might be able to undertake in the academy

Discuss jobs friends and family have.

Do any of these interest them?

Would Friend or family be willing to discuss their job with them?

Is there the possibility of a work placement to find out more.

Getting a placement

The expectation is that **students find their own placement**.

Students needs to make contact with a placement via email, written letter, in person or by telephone.

Students need to obtain following information

- Company name
- Name of the main contact at the company
- The email address of the main contact at the company
- Company address
- Company telephone number.

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How to log your placement information with us

We use an external provider call "**Unifrog**". All students have an account with **Unifrog**. Students will be emailed by Unifrog to log on if they don't have an account already.

A link to the Unifrog log in page will be put on the Yr 10 Work **Experience** page of the website.

| Start date | Deadline date | Task to be completed. |
|-------------------------------|-------------------------------|--|
| 21st September | 20th October | Student to have logged onto Unifrog and saved password. |
| 20th October 2023 | 19 th January 2024 | Student to have contacted companies and secured a placement, logged onto Unifrog and used the placement tool to complete the initial placement form on Unifrog. *Students to explain to companies that they will receive an email from Unifrog and inform them due to company firewall restrictions this email may go into their junk or spam folder. |
| 19 th January 2024 | 15 th April 2024 | Deadline for companies to reply on initial placement. *Students need to monitor Unifrog and the completion of stage two by the company, contacting them where needed. |
| 19 th January 2024 | 24 th May 2024 | Initial review of placements completed and agreed in principle. |
| 3 rd June 2024 | 28 th June 2024 | Secondary placement confirmed and uploaded to Unifrog if a placement has had to be declined |
| 28 th June 2024 | 11 th July 2024 | All students have placement. |
| 15 th July 2024 | 23 rd July 2024 | Students complete work placement |
| 23 rd July 2024 | 13 th September | Online Employer review of student and student reflection of placement completed. |
