Prior Learning

Whilst Child Development is not studied at key stage three, the planned curriculum provides the opportunity for students to develop their literacy skills in new context, it also contains elements of human biology. PSHE learning will be valuable.

Curriculum Intent – What are the curriculum aims?

This qualification is for students who wish to develop applied knowledge and practical skills in child development.

R057: Health and well-being for child development

For examination, students will learn the essential knowledge and understanding for child development covering pre-conception health and reproduction, antenatal care and preparation for, birth, postnatal care and checks, conditions for development, childhood illnesses and a child-safe environment.

R058: Create a safe environment and understand the nutritional needs of children from birth to five years Students will gain knowledge of what is needed to create a safe environment in a childcare setting and the equipment needs of babies and young children, as well as gaining understanding of the factors to be considered when choosing appropriate equipment to meet all of these needs. Students will also learn the current government dietary recommendations for healthy eating for children from birth to 5 years.

R059: Understand the development of a child from one to five.

Students will gain knowledge of, and skills in, developing activities to observe development norms in children from one up to the age of five. This work includes researching, observing a child, planning activities and evaluating them, as well as an understanding of the development norms and the benefits of play in child development.




